

Cassandra Bromfield, fashion designer and artist, was raised in this South Williamsburg apartment.

Her mother, Elaine Bromfield, was a schoolteacher, and in 1964 she bought the 894-square-foot two-bedroom apartment in Lindsay Park, an affordable-housing cooperative that was then brand new.

At the time, Cassandra was about 8 years old.



Bromfield's mother passed away in 2008, and in 2016, she decided that the apartment needed some refreshment, starting with the kitchen. She contacted interior designer Keita Turner.


